# Carteret County Senior Games Official Entry Form

## General Information

**ELIGIBILITY** A participant must be a North Carolina resident for a minimum of three (3) consecutive months of the calendar year. A person must be 50 years of age or better to participate. Age on December 31, 2015 will determine the category in which the athlete will compete. Participants will compete against others of their own age and sex as follows: 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79, 80-84, 85-89, 90-94, 95-99 and 100+. In doubles sports, the age of the youngest player determines the age group for competition.

**RULES** Carteret County Senior Games are open games. Please see Rule Changes & Reminders Page in this Official Entry Form. All events will be conducted in accordance with the 2015 Edition of the North Carolina Senior Games, Inc., Official Rules and SilverArts Booklet both of which are located on the web site at [www.ncseniorgames.org](http://www.ncseniorgames.org).

**WHAT DO I RECEIVE?** Registration fee includes complimentary participant t-shirt, participation in Athletic and/or Artistic Events and free admission to the following Events: SilverArts Exhibit at Fort Benjamin Park, Opening Ceremonies & Breakfast, and Awards Dinner and Dance.

**AWARDS** All medals will be awarded at the Awards Dinner/Dance held on April 30, 2015. Medals will be awarded for each event the athlete has placed in during the local competition. All medalists qualify to participate in the North Carolina Senior Games State Finals, Sep. 21 - 28, 2015. Exceptions: To qualify for State Finals, golfers need to meet a Minimum Performance Score (MPS) and finish in the top 3 in their age group. (Refer to Official Rules Book). ONLY First-Place Medal Winners in Cheerleading, and "Best in Show" Winners in Performing Arts; First, Second, and Third-Place Medal Winners in each subcategory for Heritage and Visual Arts and First and Second-Place Literary Arts will be submitted for State competition. Carteret County will judge and award sub-categories within Performing Arts for the Performing Arts Competition, but the performance with the highest score will be awarded "Best in Show".

**WHAT IF IT RAINS?** The Carteret County Senior Games Event Director will make the decision to continue, delay or reschedule an outdoor event due to inclement weather. Unless the weather has made conditions hazardous to the safety of volunteers and participants, events will continue in the rain. Participants should report to the event site and check-in, regardless of the weather. Up to date information will be available from the Event Manager in charge of each specific event. Failure to check-in will result in disqualification.

**STATE FINALS** All events offered at the local level will also be offered at the State Finals (except for those noted with an asterisk \*). Participants receiving medal(s) (see above) will receive a State Finals Entry Packet with their qualifying letter in the mail after the completion of the local Games. This Form must be filled out and returned to North Carolina Senior Games by August 1. Early Bird Registration is July 1. This program is sanctioned by North Carolina Senior Games, Inc. North Carolina Senior Games is sponsored State wide by the North Carolina Division of Aging and Adult Services.

**NATIONAL GAMES** The 2015 State Finals will not be a qualifying year for the National Senior Games. Website [www.nsga.com](http://www.nsga.com).

**Athletic Events/Sport** See the 2015 edition of the NCSG Official Rules Book for any changes.

**Cycling** All Carteret County Senior Games cycling events will be held in Pine Knoll Shores at McNeil Park on Oakleaf Drive. Please check <http://ccpr.recdesk.com/reckdeskportal/> for a map of the course.

**New Sport/Age Group** Locally, we will offer kayaking and paddleboarding for 2015. These events which are not state sanctioned will be open to all types of kayaks and paddleboards. *Additionally there is a 50-54 age group this year.*

**Location Changes** Please refer to the Carteret County Senior Games 2015 Schedule of Events on page 8 of this Entry Packet for locations and times or check our website at <http://ccpr.recdesk.com/reckdeskportal/>. Note that the Silverarts exhibit will be displayed at Fort Benjamin Park this year.

**Packets** Registration packets will ONLY be distributed: Monday March 30 from 10am-12pm at Fort Benjamin Park and Thurs. Apr. 9 from 8:30am - 9:00am or at 11:30am. Packets not picked up on any of these dates will be available at the Carteret County Parks & Recreation Department after May 1 through May 29.

**No packets or souvenirs will be held or kept after June 1, 2015.**

**SilverArts** See the 2015 edition of the NCSG SilverArts Manual for any changes. Also see The Specific Category Requirements for SilverArts on page 7 of this Official Entry Form.

-Performing Arts participant(s) may not have performed in any other local senior games during that games year and at least one member of all performing arts groups must reside or pay taxes in Carteret County. The "Best in Show" winning act, group or performer with the most points at the local level: must go on to compete at the State Finals.

-SilverArts registrants may attach an additional sheet of paper for entries if sufficient room is not provided. Please include the same information as requested on the SilverArts form in this Official Entry Form.

- SilverArts entries (Literary, Visual and Heritage) are required to leave their art on display for the duration of the art display - until April 30.

**Cheerleaders** CCSG Cheerleaders that register for 2015 NCSG State Finals must participate in the 2015 NCSG State Finals Opening Ceremonies in the Parade of Participants with Carteret County.

**Refunds** No refunds will be granted after April 9, 2015. A \$5 processing fee is non-refundable.

**Golf** To qualify for State Finals, golfers need to meet a minimum performance score (MPS) **and** finish in the top 3 in their age group. MPS is available from your coordinator and in the NCSG Rules Book on the NCSG website ([www.ncseniorgames.org](http://www.ncseniorgames.org)).

I release, waive, discharge and covenant not to sue the Carteret County Senior Games, its affiliated clubs, their respective administrators, directors, agents, sponsoring agencies, sponsors, advertisers and if applicable, owners and leasers of premises used to conduct the events, all of which are hereinafter referred to as “releases” from any and all liability to each of the undersigned, his or her heirs and next of kin for any and all claims, demands, losses or damages on account of injury, including death or damage to property, caused or alleged to be caused in whole or in part by the negligence of the release or otherwise. I have prepared myself for the events which I have entered by practicing prior to the Carteret County Senior Games. To the best of my knowledge and belief, I have no physical restrictions that would prohibit my participation in the events I have selected.

Carteret County Senior Games has my permission to transport me and to have a physician attend me if it is deemed necessary during my participation in local games. I agree to release and hold harmless the Carteret County Senior Games from any damage to or loss of my art entry. I certify that the art piece(s) I enter are my own work, were created after having reached age 50, and are not manufactured in any sense of the word. I grant to the Carteret County Senior Games the free and unrestricted right to use my name and picture, picture of my art work and/or written material in any broadcast, telecast or other written or photographic account to the Carteret County Senior Games without remuneration.

- I understand it is my responsibility to read and be accountable for the information in this Official Entry Form Packet and that all information and resources for finding information pertaining to Carteret County Senior Games has been offered to me.
- I understand that I am to participate by the rules of Carteret County Senior Games and know that all information can be found on the Rule Changes and Reminders Page of the Official Entry Form Packet.
- I also understand that it is my responsibility to check with my Local Senior Games Coordinator immediately following my Local Senior Games to determine if I qualified for State Finals and to get a State Finals Entry Packet. My State Finals Entry Form must be received in the NCSG office in Raleigh by 5:00pm on August 1st! I understand that this deadline is strictly enforced in fairness to all and that it is my responsibility to make sure I am registered.

## **SPECIFIC CATEGORY REQUIREMENTS FOR SILVERARTS**

See SilverArts Guidelines for general requirements.

### **A. Heritage Arts**

- Entries must be the work of the individual and not a group.
- Heritage Art entries must be an original work. Patterns may be used, but no stamped pieces will be accepted.
- Pottery must be hand built or thrown.
- Latch hook rugs and pieces from ceramic molds will not be accepted.
- All framed entries must be securely wired, ready to be hung (no serrated hooks or string). Two-dimensional work not properly framed and wired will not be displayed.
- Framed entries can be no larger than 36" x 42", including matting and frame.
- Entries can be no heavier than 50 pounds.
- All entries, except framed work, must be able to be displayed in an area 3'(W) x 3'(L) x 5'(Height).
- Groupings (sets) shall have no more than 3 separate pieces per set. All objects within each piece of the set must be contained within or attached to one of the 3 pieces of the set.
- Artist's name and title of entry must appear on, or be attached to, entry for identification.
- Artist must send a photo of entry with State Finals Entry Form and SilverArts Information Form. Photos cannot be returned.
- Artists, or their representatives, are responsible to deliver and pick-up their entry at/during the designated times.
- The heritage arts entry entered at State Finals must be the same entry that won at the Local Games.
- An artist may only submit one (1) entry per sub-category at State Finals.

### **B. Visual Arts**

- All artwork, except sculpture, must be framed (or gallery wrapped), securely wired, and ready to be hung (no serrated hooks or string). Artwork, except sculpture, not properly wired will not be displayed.
- Artwork, except sculpture, can be no larger than 36" x 42", including matting and frame.
- Entries can be no heavier than 50 pounds.
- Sculpture groupings (sets) may have no more than 3 pieces per grouping (set).
- Mixed media may be a freestanding piece.
- Freestanding entries must be able to be displayed in an area 3'(W) x 3'(L) x 5'(height).
- Artists, or their representatives, are responsible to deliver and pick-up their entry at/during the designated times.
- If on-site assembly is required, details must be specified on the Information Form for NCSG prior approval.
- The art piece must be an original work, not a print.
- Artist's name and title of entry must appear on, or be attached to, entry for identification.
- Artist must send a photograph of entry with State Finals Entry Form and SilverArts Information Form. Photos cannot be returned.
- The visual arts entry entered at State Finals must be the same entry that won at the Local Games.
- An artist may only submit one (1) entry per sub-category at State Finals.

### **C. Literary Arts**

- All entries must be typed, double-spaced, on 8-1/2 x 11 paper and have a minimum of 1" margins. A minimum font size is 10-pt type (preferably "times new roman or arial").
- Poems can be no longer than 40 lines.
- Short stories, essays, and life experiences can be no longer than 8 pages.
- All entries must have a title page, which includes title of entry, sub-category, and name of artist.
- Artist's name must not appear on the content pages.
- A display-quality copy of the winning Literary Arts entries, and two (2) additional copies, should be submitted to NCSG by the artist with their official State Finals Entry Form and SilverArts Information Form. No framed or matted entries will be accepted.
- The original and all copies will be retained by NCSG.
- The literary arts entry entered at State Finals must be the same entry that won at the Local Games.
- An artist may only submit one (1) entry per sub-category at State Finals.

### **D. Performing Arts**

- An artist may only have one (1) entry per size of act in each sub-category.
- Performing entries are limited to three (3) minutes of on-stage time. Exceeding the time limit will result in automatic disqualification. Timing is the performer's responsibility and begins with the first note of music or the first movement visible to the audience and ends with the exit of the last performer from the stage or final movement of the act.
- Performing entries may be one of the following: (a) soloists, (b) small groups (2 - 4 performers), or (c) large groups (5 or more performers). Accompanist(s) will be counted to determine size of act. No one under age 50 as of Dec. 31st will be permitted on stage and an accompanist must be a registered participant.
- All performers for all acts must enter stage right and exit stage left or begin and end on the stage. See the SilverArts Manual for a stage diagram.
- If recorded music is used, music must be a high quality CD or an mp3 file on a flashdrive or sent via online registration. Music must be sent with the State Finals Entry Form and SilverArts Information Form. No recorded instruction is permitted. This should be the only track on the CD/flashdrive or electronic file. Music may be picked up following the performance. It cannot be mailed/returned.
- At State Finals, NCSG can provide the following items: chairs, microphone(s), piano and sound system. The act is responsible for all other props and equipment and must get NCSG advance approval for use at Show. Props must be small, few, light-weight and easy to set up quickly.
- Voice presentations must be a live performance by the artist. Background music can be recorded. Lip-synch is not permitted as a performing art.
- The Group Leader, who must be a participant, must complete the SilverArts Information Form for the group and submit it with their State Finals Entry Form and each member of the group must submit their own personal State Finals Entry Form by the August 1st deadline.
- The performance at State Finals must be the same performance that won at the Local Games; i.e. same song, dance, music, etc.
- No live animals are allowed, except for service animals.
