
 New Bern Street end of Emerald Isle, then turns onto Coast Follows Hwy 58 from Fort Macon to the west - Main Route

The Beaufort area main route heads away from the busier town toward low-lying Down East before looping back. For more sightseeing, the town route winds around historic old Beaufort and along the waterfront.

- Main Route

Follows Hwy 70 from Beaufort, Merrimon Road, Laurel Road, Hwy 101.

Town Route

A 7.5 mile route that follows back streets to Ann Street, then south to Front Street to the boat ramp, and Lennoxville Road back to the way in.



The western part of the county is mostly rural apart from the area on and near Hwy 24. The east side of the White Oak River has gently rolling terrain, where the west side has long straight country roads.

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Main Route

Follows sideroads along Hwy 58 from Cedar Point to Stella then loops through Onslow County into Swansboro before returning to Cedar Point. Note that the section following Hwy 24 has a lot of traffic, although there are sidewalks available.

— Optional Route

An out-and-back to White Oak Bluff with scenic views overlooking the White Oak River adds an additional 9.2 miles.
